





Notice board in the Civilian War Graves area of Milton Cemetery



Derek Venn worked with Pat Hase from the Friends Group and put together the information regarding the 34 people that were killed during the first blitz on 4th January 1941 of which 20 were buried in the cemetery. The two nights of blitz that followed in June 1942 saw a further 102 people killed, some of whom were evacuees and holidaymakers. 45 people were buried in mass funerals at Milton Road cemetery during early July, as a result of these raids.

The board has the names, age, address and grave numbers of those killed, together with a map of the area. Derek Venn and Pat Hase worked closely with Weston-super-Mare Town Council's grounds team and all information was checked against the Town Council's burial records.
